

Promoting health and well-being in the community

The Department of Health Social Services and Public Safety in partnership with Belfast Health and Social Care Trust and the Foundation for Integrated Health are sponsoring a one day conference to explore good practice in integrating complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) in the HSC.

In the morning the conference theme will be 'support' looking at examples of service delivery and research evidence to support good practice, with particular emphasis on support in cancer care.

The afternoon session will focus on 'well-being' and 'quality of life' looking at a range of community-based initiatives, including an update on progress in the CAM Pilot Project for Northern Ireland, the first government-led integrated health initiative in the UK.

The Foundation for Integrated Health will also be announcing the winner of the Northern Ireland integrated health award which recognises how an integrated approach to healthcare can make a real difference to public health.
