

Summary

Listed below is a selection of findings relating to activity across all Programmes of Care.

- Of those people in receipt of the Home Help service, at 31 March 1999, 28% were provided for by South and East Belfast HSS Trust and Homefirst Community HSS Trust (Table 1.1).
- Of those people in receipt of the Meals on Wheels service, at 31 March 1999, 39% were provided for by South and East Belfast HSS Trust and Ulster Community & Hospitals HSS Trust (Table 1.3).
- 95% of those blind and partially sighted people who had contact with Providers during 1998/99 were living within the community (Table 1.6).
- 31% of all people who were deaf, either with or without speech, who had contact with Providers in 1998/99 were aged under 25 years (Table 1.9 & Table 1.11).
- Of all the people who are hard of hearing and who contacted Providers in 1998/99, 19% made contact with one Provider: Armagh & Dungannon HSS Trust (Table 1.13).

- At 31 March 1999 there were 14,756 people in Northern Ireland benefiting from care management – over two fifths (43%) of these being supported in their own homes (Table 1.15).
- Chickenpox accounted for 52% of all Infectious Disease notifications in Northern Ireland during 1998. Meningitis was responsible for 0.7% of all notifications (Table 1.16).
- There were 9,464 people registered at statutory day care facilities at 31 March 1999. Over one third (35%) of this number were registered at South and East Belfast HSS Trust and Homefirst Community HSS Trust (Table 1.17).
- Over one fifth (21%) of all physically disabled people (in general classes) who had contact with Providers in 1998/99 were with Sperrin Lakeland HSS Trust (Table 1.18).
- Private homes were providing 37% of all available places (on average) in residential accommodation in Northern Ireland during 1998/99 (Table 1.19).
- Of the 9,788 beds that were available in registered nursing homes at 31 March 1999, almost one third (32%) were with Homefirst Community HSS Trust and South and East Belfast HSS Trust (Table 1.20).
- 62% of the 2,324 children being looked after by HSS Trusts at 31 March 1999 had been in care for three years or more at this date and almost two thirds (65%) of all children in care were in Foster Care (foster parents or fostered to relatives) (Table 2.3 & Table 2.4).
- There were 1,463 children on the child protection register at 31 March 1999. 38% of these fell into the ‘Neglect Only’ category (Table 2.6).

- 47% of the average available day care places for children in 1998/99 were provided by registered childminders in private dwellings (Table 2.8).
- During 1998/99, nearly three quarters (71%) of those women invited for their first ever breast screen actually responded to the invitation and were screened as a result. Of the 7,452 who were screened 5% were referred for assessment (Table 7.3).
- Children living in the Eastern Board area had the lowest MMR uptake rate in 1998/99 with 86.7% of children being immunised before their second birthday, compared to the highest rate of 93.4 % in the Southern Board area (Table 7.2).
- The 'Ancillary and General' staff grouping made up the largest proportion (37%) of Community and Personal Social Services staff in Northern Ireland in 1998/99. The 'Social Services' group accounted for 23% of staff (Table 1.21).
- Average available places in residential accommodation decreased by 2% from 7,163 to 7,027 in the five year period up to 1998/99 (Table 1.22).
- The average number of available places in day nurseries, play groups and with registered childminders increased by 13% to 40,085 between 1994/95 and 1998/99 (Table 1.22).
- The uptake rate in children in Northern Ireland for the MMR vaccine decreased from 92.0% in 1994/95 to 90.1% in 1998/99 (Table 1.22).

Programmes of Care

Programmes of Care are divisions of health care, into which activity and finance data are assigned, so as to provide a common management framework. They are used to plan and monitor the health service, by allowing performance to be measured, targets set and services managed on a comparative basis. In total, there are nine Programmes of Care. However, only those referred to in this publication are shown below and the definition is restricted to cover just community activity.

Family and Child Care (POC 3)

This programme is mainly concerned with activity and resources relating to the provision of social services support for families and/or children. This includes Children Looked After; Child Protection; Child Abuse; Adoption; Fostering; Day Care; Women's Hostels/Shelters and Family Centres. This is not a definitive list of the type of support which may be offered under this programme. This programme includes community contacts by any health professional where the primary reason for the contact is because of family or child care issues.

Elderly Care (POC 4)

This programme covers all activity, and resources used, by any health professional, including all community contacts with those aged 65 and over except where the reason for the contact was because of mental illness or learning disability. All community contacts where the reason for the contact was dementia should also be included, regardless of the patient's age. However, Down's Syndrome patients who develop dementia should remain in the Learning Disability Programme of Care for any dementia related care or treatment. All physically and/or sensorily disabled patients aged 65 and over should be included as well as all work relating to homes for the elderly, including those for the Elderly Mentally Infirm. Age alone is not the determining factor in allocating patients and clients to the Elderly Care Programme of Care - community contacts are allocated by the primary reason for the contact which could result in a person aged 65 or over being allocated to the Mental Health Programme of Care if the reason for the contact was because of mental illness.

Mental Health (POC 5)

This programme covers all activity, and resources used, by any health professional, including all community contacts where the primary reason for the contact was due to mental health. If the reason for contact is that the patient has dementia, the activity should be allocated to the Elderly Care Programme of Care. However, Down's Syndrome patients who develop dementia should remain in the Learning Disability Programme of Care. All work and resources relating to residential accommodation for the Elderly Mentally Infirm should be excluded. This is included in the Elderly Care programme.

Learning Disability (POC 6)

This programme covers all activity, and resources used, by any health professional, including all community contacts where the primary reason for the contact was learning disability, regardless of age. All community contacts with Down's Syndrome patients who develop dementia, for any dementia related care or treatment should be included. All contacts in learning disability homes and units should also be included.

Physical and Sensory Disability (POC 7)

This programme includes all community contacts by any health professional where the primary reason for the contact is physical and/or sensory disability. All patients and clients aged 65 and over are excluded. These contacts should be allocated to the Elderly Care programme.

Health Promotion and Disease Prevention (POC 8)

This programme includes all community and GP based activity relating to health promotion and disease prevention. This includes all screening, well women/men clinics, child health surveillance, school health clinics, family planning clinics, health education and promotion clinics, vaccination and immunisation and community dental screening and prevention work.

Primary Health and Adult Community (POC 9)

This programme includes all work, except screening, carried out by General Medical Practitioners, General Dental Practitioners, General Ophthalmic Practitioners and Pharmacists. It includes contacts by any health professional with community patients aged between 16 and 64, for whom the primary reason for the contact is other than mental illness, learning disability or physical and sensory disability.

Definitions

Average Available and Occupied Places

Average availability and occupancy should be calculated by Providers from data collected on a daily basis. However, when this is not possible averages are calculated using weekly or monthly data and dividing by 52 or 12 respectively.

Care Packages

These are the main forms of care recommended through care management, which include the functions of assessing need, care planning, co-ordinating and reviewing services.

Face to Face Contact

A contact which is made by one or more health professionals with a patient or client. The contact occurs when the patient/client attends a clinic or a domiciliary visit is made to see the patient/client. The data in the tables refer to the number of people who had at least one face to face contact during the year and not the actual number of contacts made.

Infectious Disease Notifications

Cases of infectious diseases are those notifiable by the doctor in attendance to the Director of Public Health for each Health and Social Services Board under the Public Health Act (Northern Ireland) 1967 and Infectious Disease regulations.

Nursing Home

A nursing home is a facility staffed by nurses 24 hours per day, which provides services for clients/patients requiring residential nursing care. Medical care continues to be the responsibility of the client/patient's GP. The premises must be owned, managed or leased by the HPSS or a health care contract must exist between the HPSS and the owners of the premises for the provision of care.

Residential Care Home

This is residential accommodation, staffed 24 hours a day, providing board and general care to residents. Such premises are provided for vulnerable persons (e.g. children, the elderly, the physically disabled and those mentally ill or with a learning disability) who require care and supervision in the circumstances where nursing care would normally be inappropriate. The premises must be owned, managed or leased by the HPSS or a health care contract must exist between the HPSS and the owners of the premises for the provision of care.

Residential Accommodation

Statutory - any home provided by the Health and Social Services Boards or Health and Social Services Trusts under the provisions of the Health and Personal Social Services (NI) Order 1972.

Voluntary - any home, registered as a home for persons in need, in accordance with the Registered Homes (NI) Order 1992. Voluntary organisation means any association carrying on or proposing to carry on activities otherwise than for the purpose of gain by the Association or by individuals thereof.

Private - refers to a home registered as a home for persons in need in accordance with the Registered Homes (NI) Order 1992.

Client Groups

Elderly - refers to persons who are aged 65 years or more and who are not included in any of the other client groups.

Physically/Sensorily Disabled - refers to persons who are substantially and permanently disabled by illness, or otherwise, including the chronically sick. This group will include the following groups: blind, partially sighted, deaf with speech, deaf without speech, hard of hearing and general classes (i.e. those whose primary handicap is neither visual nor auditory).

Blind and Partially Sighted - refers to persons who are either registered or registerable as blind or partially sighted.

Designated Mentally Ill - refers to persons who in the professional opinion of a doctor - GP or Psychiatrist, are suffering from a mental or psychiatric illness. Mental illness means a state of mind which affects a person's thinking, perceiving, emotion or judgement to the extent that he/she requires care or medical treatment in his/her own interests or in the interests of other people.

Learning Disabled - refers to persons who have a state of arrested or incomplete development of mind which includes significant impairment of intelligence and social functioning. To be included in this group a person must be on the Board's register of learning disabled people.

Without Material Handicap - refers to those people, without a physical or mental impairment or learning disability, who have not been included in other client groups.

Family and Child Care

Child

Under the Children (Northern Ireland) Order 1995 the term child is defined as 'a person under the age of eighteen'.

Child Protection Register

A register must be maintained by each Trust listing every child in the Trust who has been abused or is considered to be at risk of abuse, and who is currently the subject of a child protection plan.

Abuse Categories

Neglect - The actual or likely persistent or severe neglect of a child, or the failure to protect a child from exposure to any kind of danger, including cold and starvation, or persistent failure to carry out important aspects of care, resulting in significant impairment of the child's health or development, including non-organic failure to thrive.

Physical Abuse - Actual or likely deliberate physical injury to a child, or wilful or neglectful failure to prevent physical injury or suffering to a child including deliberate poisoning, suffocation or Munchausen syndrome by proxy.

Sexual Abuse - Actual or likely sexual exploitation of a child or adolescent. The child may be dependent and/or developmentally immature.

Emotional Abuse - Actual or likely persistent or severe emotional ill-treatment or rejection resulting in severe adverse effects on the emotional, physical and/or behavioural development of a child. All abuse involves some emotional ill-treatment. This category should be used where it is the main or only form of abuse.

Day Care Facilities

Adult Training/Social Education Centres - These are establishments mainly for people over 16 years of age with a learning disability in which social and occupational training is provided with the object of preparing those, who have the ability, to progress into workshops.

Day Centres - These are centres which have a full time organiser and where professional staff are employed. They are open five or more days each week and provide a variety of activities for members and facilities for meals, bathing, hairdressing, chiropody etc.

Workshops - This is where industrial therapy and contract work is undertaken; aimed at preparing those who are suitable for placement in open or sheltered employment in the community.

Health Promotion and Disease Prevention

Immunisation Uptake Rates

These refer to children who have completed a primary course of immunisation (normally three doses) before their second birthday. The location where the immunisation was carried out is irrelevant as it is the residency of the child being immunised which is recorded.

Vaccinations (BCG)

This includes vaccinations given to persons in high risk groups and those given to contacts of known TB cases, as well as vaccinations given after the administration of a skin test.

Explanatory Notes

Source: The data contained in this publication, unless otherwise stated, have been compiled from the quarterly/annual Korner Aggregate Returns (KARs) which were introduced from 1 April 1988 and the Children Order (NI) 1995 returns which were effective from 4 November 1996. The data relate to activity occurring in the fields of community health and personal social services. The cut-off point for amendments to tables was 22 October 1999 and any amendments notified by Providers after this date will not have been included.

Programmes of Care (POCs): In line with the revised publications policy by Regional Information Branch (RIB), this bulletin has been structured on a POC basis. This should facilitate analysis by individuals with an interest in specific POCs. However, an overall NI summary section has also been included for those requiring an overall view of activity.

A number of tables in the 'NI Summary' section are not replicated for individual POC sections, either because the activity contained in the table is not relevant to a particular POC or because it is not possible for the table to be broken down to individual POC level. Conversely, in some cases tables are presented for individual POCs which are relevant only within those POCs.

A number of tables have been broken down by age group and a 'Not Known' category has been included on such tables. However, as age can be a determining factor when apportioning activity to individual POCs, it has been necessary to apportion activity where the age is not known to the POC that accounts for the greatest proportion of that activity.

Healthcare Providers: This bulletin presents data broken down by Providers where that particular Provider had a community service (see Appendix 1 for a complete list of Providers which had a community service in 1997/98). It is important to note that in a minority of cases the service may have taken place in a hospital setting. A small number of analyses have not been broken down by Provider but rather have been disaggregated by Board of Treatment/Residence or are at 'Northern Ireland' level due to the nature of the return on which the analysis is based. When comparing data at Provider level with earlier years it is important to note that due to a reorganisation of facilities within some Providers the comparison may not be on a like with like basis.

Data Quality: Only data deemed to be of sufficient quality have been published in this bulletin. A number of other specific activity areas (e.g. Professions Allied to Medicine) have been omitted due to the incomplete nature and/or poor data quality of the relevant central returns. In consequence, there is no specific section included in relation to community activity in POC 2 (Maternity and Child Health). These problem areas are being considered in an ongoing review of data quality within Regional Information Branch.

Data Availability/Format: A number of the tables contained in the bulletin are also available on a quarterly basis. In addition, data can be supplied in spreadsheet format (Microsoft Excel Version 5.0) in order to aid secondary analysis. These tables are also available at www.dhssni.gov.uk/hpss/statistics/.
