The Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety is seeking to appoint 2 Non-Executive Directors to the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service Health & Social Care (HSC) Trust. Due to forthcoming vacancies, the first appointment will be made in October 2010, the second in December 2010.

The functions of the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service (NIAS) are to provide goods and services for the purposes of health and social care and, in particular, to provide and manage ambulance and associated services; and such other services as can reasonably be carried out in conjunction with the provision and management of ambulance and associated services. Its mission is to 'deliver effective and efficient care to people in need and improve the health and well-being of the community through the delivery of high quality ambulance services'.

There are two categories of Non-Executive Director:

Lay Member Post - There are no specific requirements for this post.

Financial Member Post - Experience of Financial Management in an organisation with an annual financial budget/turnover of £30m.

Essential Criteria

Applicants for the Lay Member post must meet the following five essential criteria:

Making an impact with others & displays a range of political skills; Committing to the non-executive role; Thinking strategically; Analytical thinking; and, Knowledge and understanding of the Health Service in Northern Ireland.
