## **Statistics on Smoking Cessation Services in Northern Ireland: 2004/2005**

This information release, produced by the Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety's Hospital Information Branch, provides information on smoking cessation services.

Data are included on the monitoring of smoking cessation services in Northern Ireland during the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005.

This report also provides an analysis of data collected in 2004/05 in respect of clients who set a quit date during 2003/04 (52 week follow-up).

Information within this report has been produced from a new web based recording system. Data is downloaded at a particular point in time. Figures here are correct as of 5<sup>th</sup> July 2005.

### **Summary**

Within Northern Ireland, during the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005:

- 7,369 people set a quit date through the smoking cessation services. This is an increase of 1,010 (16%) on the figure for the same reporting period, 2003/04.
- Of those setting a quit date, the majority (81%) were aged 18-59 years: 3% were under 18, 27% were aged 18-34, 24% were aged 35-44, 30% were aged 45-59, and 16% were aged 60 and over.

- The majority of people received Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT) or bupropion (Zyban). 70% of people received NRT only, 1% received bupropion only, and 1% received both NRT and bupropion.
- At the 4 week follow-up, 3,771 had successfully quit (based on self-report), 51% of those setting a quit date. This is an increase of 3 percentage points from the figure for the same reporting period, 2003/04.
- At the 4 week follow-up, of those who successfully quit (based on self-report), 1,918 had their non-smoking status confirmed by Carbon Monoxide (CO) validation, 26% of those setting a quit date. However, smoking cessation services did not attempt CO validation on all people who had successfully quit at the 4 week follow-up (based on self-report). This is a decrease of 17 percentage points from the figure for the same reporting period, 2003/04. This can be partly explained as a result of difficulties in the use of the appropriate equipment to carry out the CO validation tests.

## Introduction

It is estimated that over the period 1998-2002, smoking caused approximately 2,300 deaths in Northern Ireland each year<sup>1</sup>. It is the single greatest preventable cause of premature death and avoidable illness. The Five Year Northern Ireland Tobacco Action Plan, published in June 2003, set targets for reducing the prevalence of smoking among adults, pregnant women and young people (aged 11-16). The development of cessation services is a key element of the overall aim to tackle smoking.

The Continuous Household Survey, which biennially includes questions about smoking, showed that, in 2004/05, adult smoking prevalence was 26% (27% males and 25% females). In the same survey, over three quarters (77%) said that they would like to give up smoking. Giving up is not easy because nicotine is highly addictive and repeated quit attempts may be required before total abstinence is achieved.

## Background

Smoking cessation services provide a new approach to helping people to quit smoking. They include the provision of **brief opportunistic advice** by a range of health professionals and **specialist services** in appropriate settings. Only the latter are monitored centrally. Both services are defined in **Annex A**.

The Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety developed monitoring arrangements for smoking cessation services in the four Health & Social Services Boards. Each Health & Social Services Board was required to provide information on a quarterly basis to enable the Department to monitor figures. The central requirements for the monitoring returns are kept to a minimum and are designed to be a subset of the information required locally to monitor and evaluate the service. This bulletin provides an analysis of these monitoring returns.

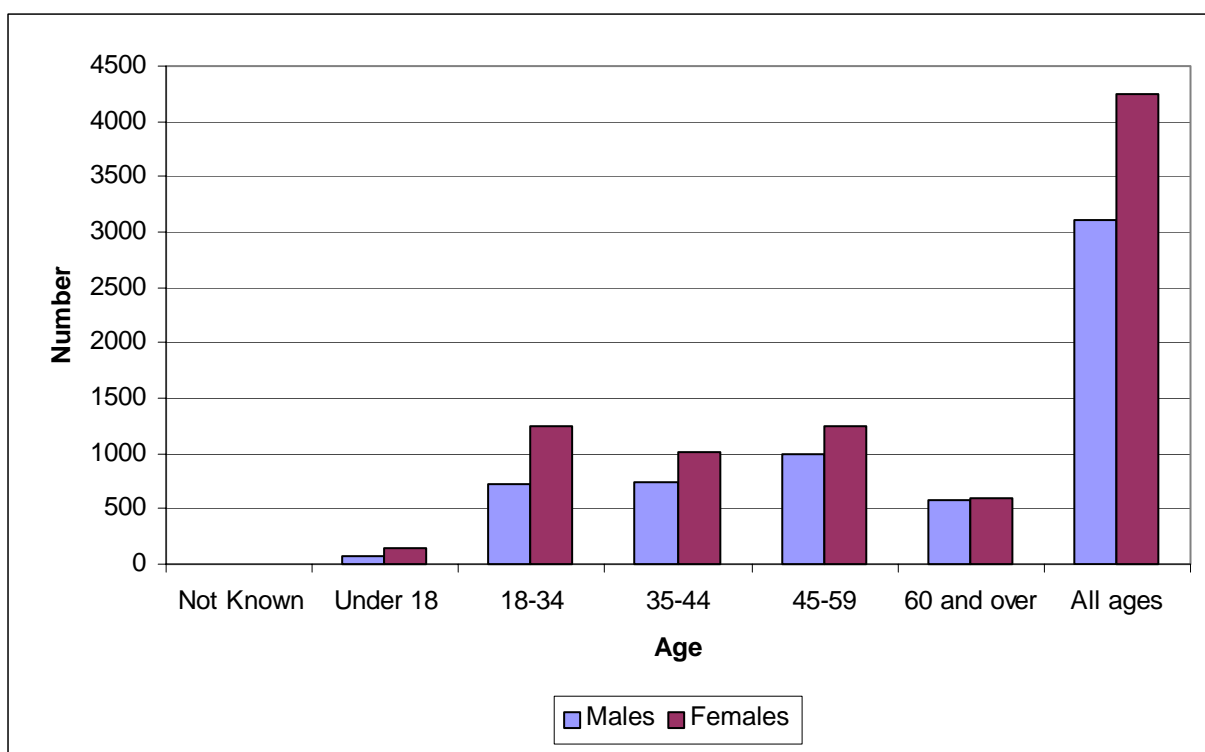
## Results

### Clients setting a quit date

(Figure 1, Annex C: Tables 1, 2 a,b,c & 4)

During the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005, a total of 7,369 people set a quit date in smoking cessation services. Over half (58%) were women, although the prevalence of smoking is similar for men (27%) and women (25%). The majority (81%) were aged 18-59 years: 27% were aged 18-34, 24% were aged 35-44, 30% were aged 45-59. At the age extremes, 3% were under 18, and 16% were aged 60 and over.

### Therapeutic Interventions

(Table 3, Annexe F)

The use of supportive drug therapy in the attempt to quit smoking was recorded for each client. Nicotine Replacement Therapy was the most popular choice with 70% of those who set a quit date opting for NRT only. Just 1% received bupropion (Zyban) only, while only 1% received both NRT and bupropion either concurrently or consecutively. 11% of those setting a quit date did not receive either medical assistance and for 18% the treatment option was unknown.

In 2004/05, the number who received free prescriptions was recorded for all Health & Social Services Boards and are as follows; in the Eastern Health & Social Services Board 1,618 (59%); 1,074 (54%), within the Northern Health & Social Services Board; within the Southern Health & Social Services Board 919 clients (62%); and 746 (65%) within the Western Health & Social Services Board.

### Outcome at 4 week follow-up

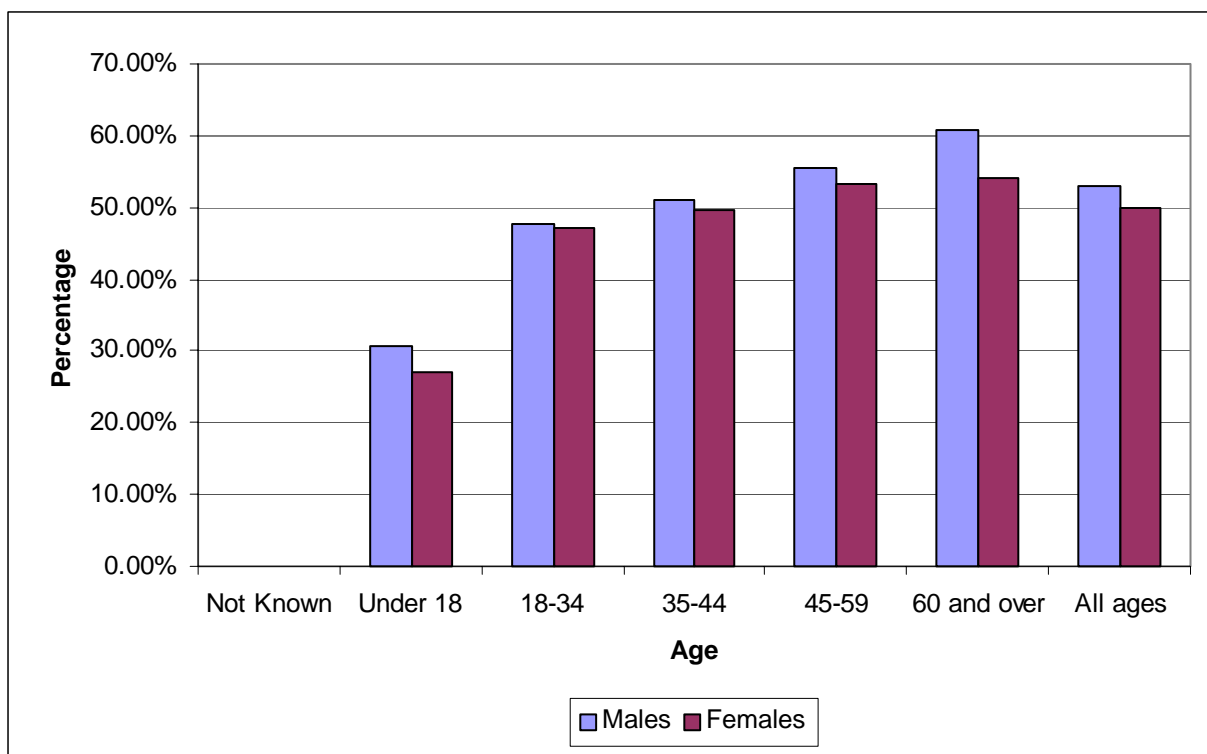
(Figure 2, 3, Annex C: Tables 2 a,b,c & 3 and Annexe F)

The cessation services were expected to follow up clients to find out their smoking status 4 weeks after the quit date, based on self-report by the client. Service providers attempted the 4 week follow-up for 6,525 (89%) of those clients who set a quit date.

At 4 weeks a successful quitter was defined as someone who had not smoked over the previous two week period (the first two weeks are ignored to allow for initial lapses). At the 4 week follow-up, 51% of all those setting a quit date had successfully quit (based on self-report).

Over a fifth (21%) of all those setting a quit date were unable to be contacted for the follow-up at 4 weeks. In addition, specialist services were also asked to confirm non-smoking status by carbon monoxide (CO) validation: 26% of those setting a quit date had their non-smoking status confirmed by CO validation (compared with 51% for self-report). However, smoking cessation services did not attempt CO validation on all people who had successfully quit at the 4 week follow-up (based on self-report). As a result of difficulties in the use of the appropriate equipment to carry out the CO validation tests, the numbers being tested at the 4 week follow-up point were greatly reduced.

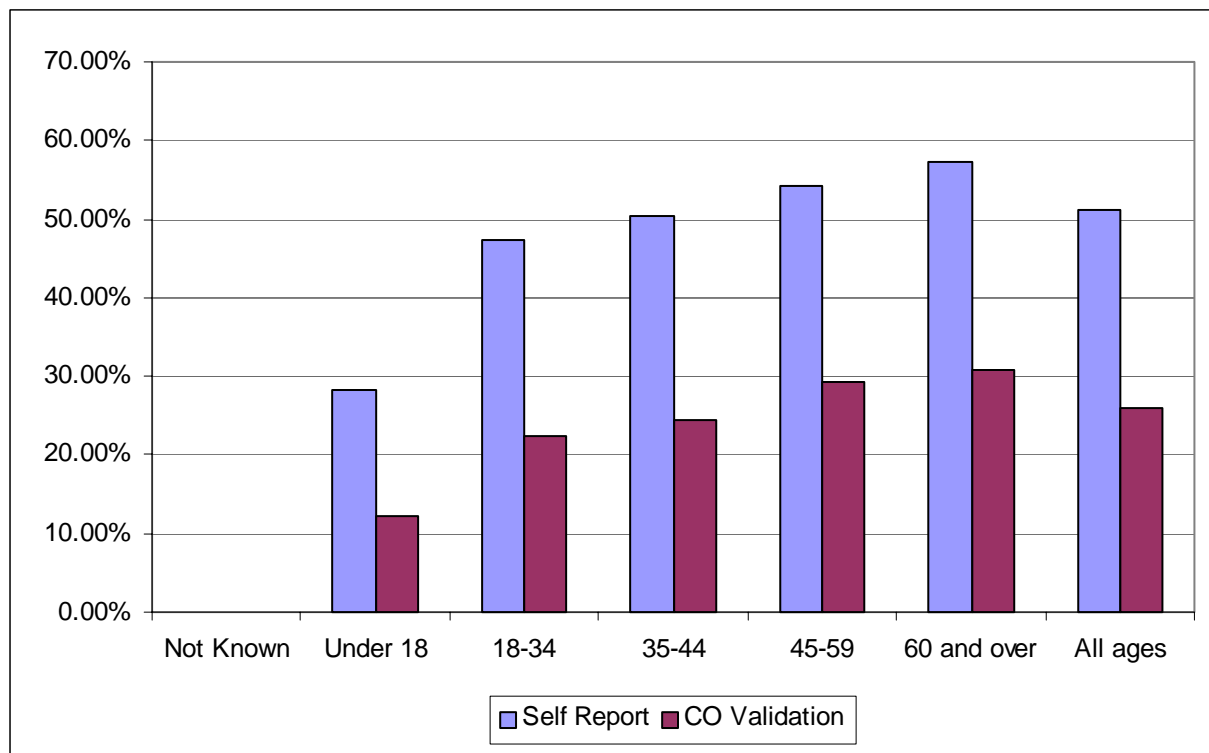
**Figure 2 Percentage who had successfully quit at 4-week follow-up (self report) by age and gender**



In general, success at 4 weeks increased with age, from 28% for the under 18s to 57% for those aged 60 and over based on the self report.

The 4-week success rates were similar for men and women (53% and 50% respectively).

For CO validation a similar pattern of success at 4 weeks increasing with age emerged, 12% for the under 18s to 31% for the 60 and over age group. Although, as a result of the unavailability of equipment to carry out CO validation tests, the number of clients being tested at the 4 week follow-up point has greatly reduced.

The 4-week success rates were similar for men and women (27% and 25% respectively).

The percentage of all those who successfully quit at the 4 week follow-up, based on self report and CO validation, peaks at the 60 and over age group, with 57% and 31% respectively.

Clients who used NRT only had a 4 week quit rate of 66%, while those who used Zyban only had a quit rate at 4 weeks of 61%. If clients used both these therapeutic interventions then the quit rate at 4 weeks was 70%. If neither was used in their attempt to give up smoking then the quit rate at 4 weeks was 36%.

Of the 2,082 who had not quit at 4 week follow-up, 1,340 (64%) had reduced their smoking intake and 972 (47%) had indicated they intended to rejoin the smoking cessation programme.

Of those who had participated in the smoking cessation programme before 53% quit at 4 weeks, (self report), while 51% of those who hadn't participated before, quit at 4 weeks (self report).

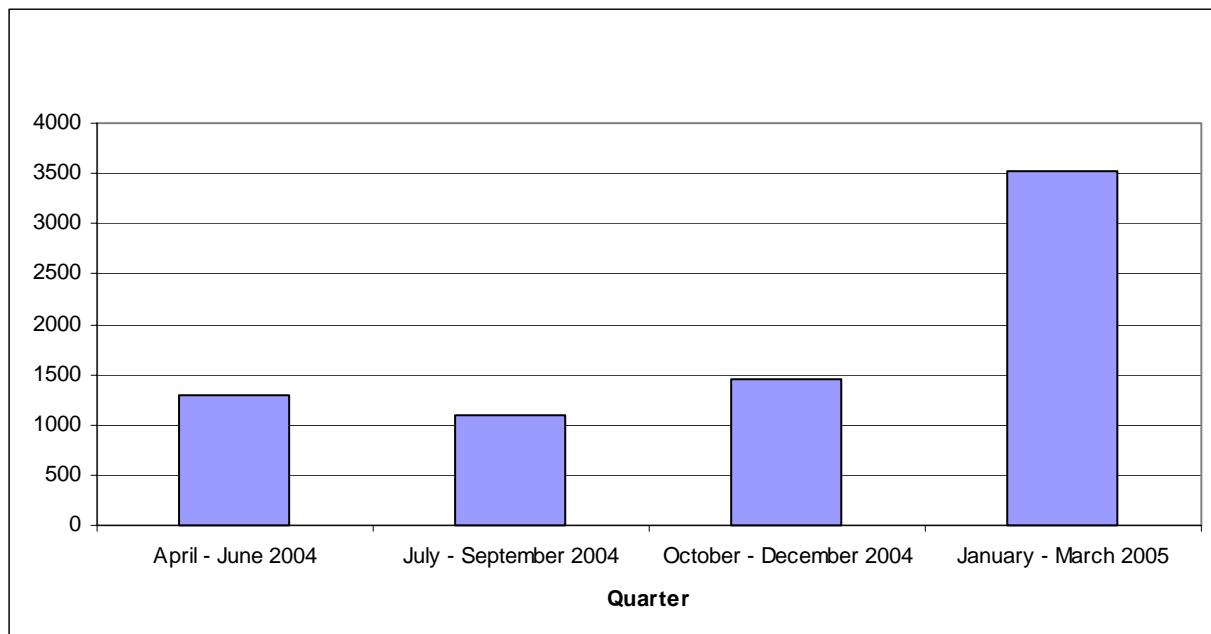
Clients who took part in both group and one-to-one sessions had a better quit rate (68%, self report), than those who only attended one type of session with 55%.

## Quarterly Comparison

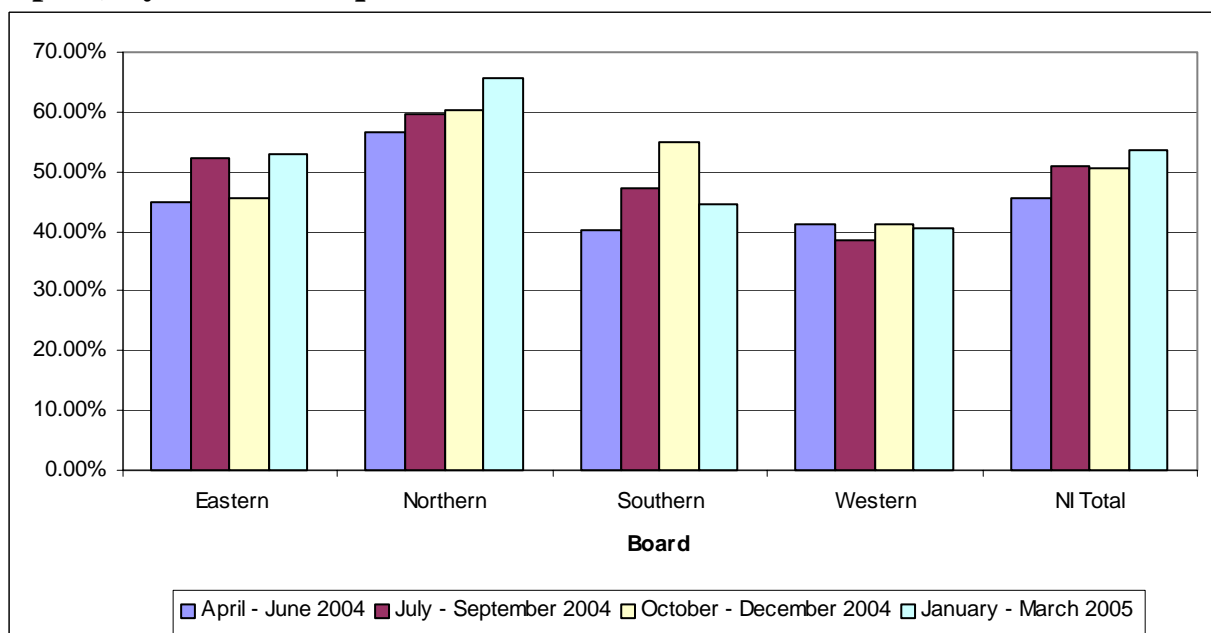
(Figures 4, 5 & 6)

During the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005, a total of 7,369 people set a quit date in smoking cessation services. The majority of those setting a quit date during 2004/05 did so in the fourth quarter, 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005, 3,520 (48%). 1,290 (18%) set a quit date in the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004 to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2004, 1,097 (15%) set a quit date in the period 1<sup>st</sup> July 2004 to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2004 and 1,462 (20%) set a quit date in the period 1<sup>st</sup> October 2004 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2004.

**Figure 4 Percentage of those setting a quit date by quarter**

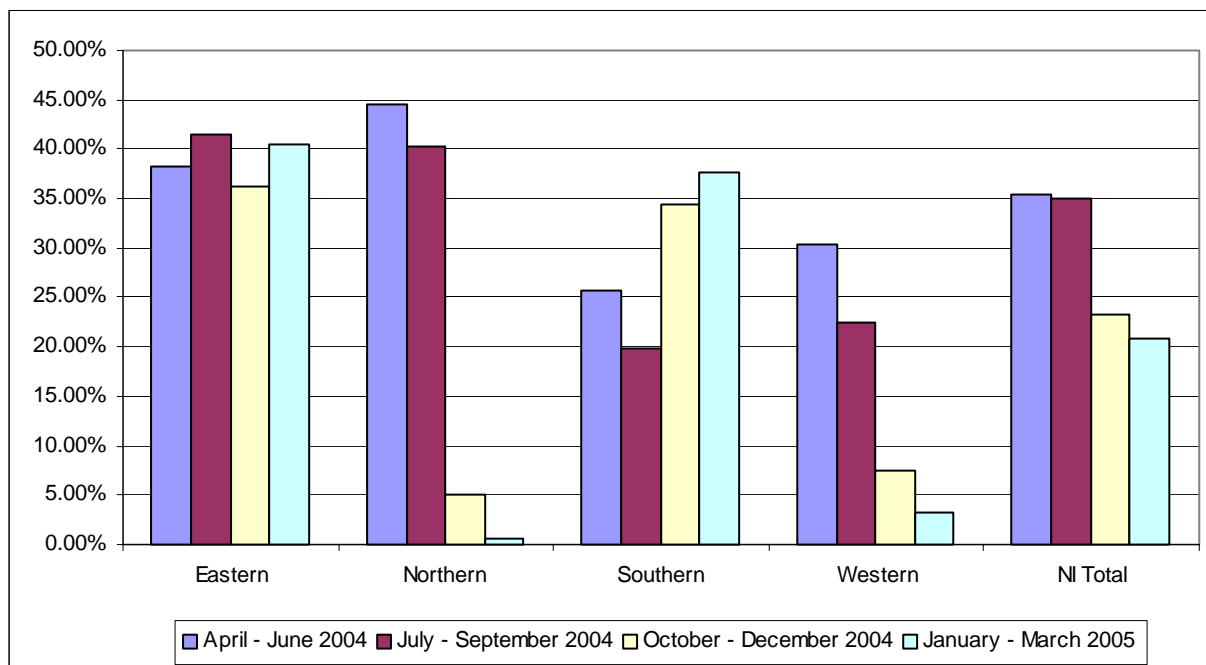


**Figure 5 Percentage who had successfully quit at 4 week follow-up (Self report) by board and quarter**



For the Northern Ireland total, the most successful quarter was the 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> March quarter, with 1,885 (54%) quitting at the 4 week follow-up based on self report.

The first quarter, 1st April to 30th June 2004 was the most successful for those quitting at the 4 week follow-up based on CO validation, with 457 (35%) quitting. Although, as a result of the unavailability of equipment to carry out CO validation tests the number of clients being tested at the 4 week follow-up point has greatly reduced.

At the 4 week follow-up, information was collected on pregnant women using the service, however, due to technical problems with the recording system, no figures are currently available in relation to pregnant women utilising the smoking cessation services.

### Health & Social Services Board Comparisons

(Tables 4 to 6)

These tables show data for the four Health & Social Services Board Areas separately (Eastern, Northern, Southern, and Western).

The Eastern and Northern Health & Social Services Boards accounted for nearly two-thirds (64%) of those setting a quit date. The Northern Health & Social Services Board had the most successful quit rate at the 4-week follow-up point for the self-report with 63% for the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005. The Eastern Health & Social Services Board had the highest quit rate with 39% based on CO validation monitoring at the 4 week follow-up. Although, it is important to note that as a result of the unavailability of equipment to carry out CO validations, the number being tested at the 4 week follow-up point has greatly reduced.

## **Health Groups**

(Tables 7 and 8)

These tables indicate how many smoking cessation services within each Health Group have provided information on clients, how many clients have attended these various health groups and the 4 week quit rates based on self-report during 2004/05.

It is important to note that certain health groups may have provided a smoking cessation service but have not returned information on their clients or other health groups may offer the smoking cessation service but have not attended any clients during 2004/05 and therefore do not feature in the tables. In addition, providers of smoking cessation services may not currently offer this service but have had the facility available some time during 2004/05.

## **Outcome at 52 week follow-up (Review of 2003/2004 Quitters)**

The cessation services were also expected to follow up clients to find out their smoking status 52 weeks after the quit date, based on self-report by the client. A client should be regarded as a non-smoker at 52 weeks if they have not smoked at any time since two weeks after their original quit date. It is important to note that service providers may have carried out the 52 week follow-up but have not returned information relating to the client.

The Eastern Health & Social Services Board's review of 2003/2004 quitters was produced using a total of 596 people (69.3% of service users in 2003/04). Of these, 203 reported to be still not smoking (self report) equating to 12% of those who set a quit date and 23.6% of those who quit at 4 weeks in 2003/04.

In the Northern Health & Social Services Board, a total of 516 were successfully followed up. This number represented 42% of those who had attended at a 4 week quit check. Of those who attended a 52 week follow-up, 179 had still quit smoking (self report) representing 15% of those setting a quit date and 34% who quit at 4 weeks in 2003/04.

The Southern Health & Social Services Board, 461 clients, representing 91.1% of those who had quit at the 4 week follow-up, were contacted at the 52 week review. 144 were recorded as still having quit (self report) at this 52 week point representing 13% of those who set a quit date and 28.4% who quit at 4 weeks in 2003/04.

In the Western Health & Social Services Board, 407 were followed up, representing 48% of those who quit at 4 weeks. 313 of these had been recorded as having successfully quit (self report). This represents a quit rate of 16% of the number setting a quit date and 37% of the number who quit at 4 weeks in 2003/04.

## **Comparison with 2003/04**

(Tables 9a,b,c)

Comparing 2003/04 to 2004/05, numbers setting a quit date increased by 16% (1,010). The percentage of those quitting at the 4 week follow-up, based on self report, decreased by 3 percentage points. The percentage of those quitting at the 4 week follow-up, based on CO validation, decreased by 17 percentage points. It is important to note that smoking cessation services did not attempt CO validation on all people who had successfully quit at the 4 week follow-up (based on self report). As a result of the unavailability of equipment to carry out CO validations the number being tested at the 4 week follow-up point has greatly reduced.

## Comparison with England

The quarterly report 'Statistics on NHS Stop Smoking Services in England, April 2004 to March 2005' provided provisional results from the monitoring of the services. It states that 529,520 people set a quit date through the smoking cessation services. Of these, 56% had successfully quit, based on self report at the 4 week follow-up, while 36% had successfully quit based on CO validation. The equivalent figures for Northern Ireland are 51% and 26% respectively.

## Priority Groups

(Tables 10 and 11, Annexe F)

While the smoking cessation services are aimed at the population as a whole, three target groups have been identified as requiring particular action. These are:

- Children and young people who smoke (aged 11-16)
- Disadvantaged adults who smoke (aged 18 and over); and
- Pregnant women who smoke.

On examination of the age group 11 to 16, only 21% of those setting a quit date quit (self report) at the 4 week follow-up, which is the lowest amongst all age groups. The quit rate for males and females in this age groups were quite similar with 20% and 22%, respectively.

The Continuous Household Survey, which biennially includes questions about smoking, showed that, in 2004/05, smoking prevalence was 26% for those classed as working and 53% for those unemployed. It is suggested that people give up smoking for reasons connected to optimism. Higher deprivation and stress levels experienced by those less well off do not motivate smokers to quit (Action on Smoking and Health, ASH – Smoking and Health Inequalities).

Clients who set a quit date were grouped into two categories, based on the answer they had provided for their employment status, working and unemployed (full time student and other/unknown groups were excluded). During the monitoring period 2004/05, 54% of those setting a quit date (excluding full-time student and other/unknown) were working and 46% were unemployed. At the 4 week follow-up, 54% of those were classed as working had quit based on self report, while 49% of the unemployed group had stopped smoking.

Clients, at the initial stage, were also asked for their postcode, which was automatically converted into the ward and local district council. Smoking prevalence rates in those areas of highest deprivation are greater than those areas more affluent. The Continuous Household Survey, showed that, in 2004/05, smoking prevalence was 30% for those in most deprived areas and 22% for those in the least deprived areas (based on Local District Council and broken down into quintiles).

Analysis of the information collected during the 2004/05 monitoring period indicates that those aged 18 and over in the bottom quintile of wards ranked in order of deprivation score (see Annexe A, point 3), made up a third (33%) of those setting a quit date but only just over a tenth (13%) came from the more affluent areas. For those in the bottom quintile of wards had a quit rate, based on self report, of 50% while those in the top quintile of wards had a quit rate of 57%. This illustrates that those in the most deprived areas find it slightly more difficult to give up smoking than those in the most affluent areas.

As mentioned earlier, due to technical problems with the recording system, no figures are currently available in relation to pregnant women utilising the smoking cessation services.

## **Equality Monitoring**

(Annex D)

Section 75 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998 requires public bodies, in carrying out their functions, to have due regard to the need to promote equality of opportunity and without prejudice to this, to also have regard to the desirability of promoting good relations. In order to address this obligation the Health and Social Services Boards were requested to undertake equality monitoring with those individuals accessing the services.

Many service users did not complete the equality forms, as they were voluntary. Consequently it is unclear if those who returned their forms accurately reflect all persons who accessed the services.

Smoking cessation services are still relatively new and have not yet rolled out to all areas across Northern Ireland. Consequently the proportions of the equality groupings accessing the services may not reflect the overall proportions in the Northern Ireland population. Indeed there are very little data available about the equality groupings of smokers or those who wish to stop smoking within the Northern Ireland population with which this information can be compared.

Charts showing the information on equality groupings by Health And Social Services Board are provided in Annex D.

## **Service Providers and Deprivation Maps**

(Annex E)

Maps showing the location of smoking cessation services and deprivation at ward level constructed using the NI Multiple Deprivation Measure are displayed in Annex E.

Within this annex there is also a list of the service providers for each of the four Health & Social Services Boards, as at the time of this report. Please be aware that some changes may have occurred since list was compiled. Smoking Cessation Co-ordinators within the four Health & Social Services Boards are using these to identify gaps in provision and sign-up new service providers.

## **Additional Information**

(Annexe F)

During the initial contact with clients additional information is collected in relation to the client himself or herself and is presented in Annexe F.

On examination of this additional information it was discovered that those who classed themselves as 'retired' had the highest quit rate (self report) with 57%, compared to the other employment status categories.

Those who smoke on average '15 to 19' cigarettes during weekdays had the best quit rate, self-report of 53%, while those on '10 to 14' cigarettes on average at the weekends had a quit rate of 55%.

Clients who gave 'Medical reasons' as the decision to attempt to give had the largest quit rate, self report with 53%.

Of those who stated they smoked a 'pipe' had a better quit rate (67%, self report), than those who smoked either 'cigarettes' (51%, self report) or 'cigars' (63%, self report).

### **Future Monitoring**

It is hoped that all providers of smoking cessation services will have access to this web based method of recording in the near future to improve data collection.

## **Annex A**

### **1. Data Quality**

Due to technical problems with the new web based recording system, no figures are currently available in relation to pregnant women utilising the smoking cessation services.

Varying interpretation of the monitoring guidance led to inconsistency in the return of monitoring forms.

As a result of difficulties in the use of the appropriate equipment to carry out the CO validation tests it has greatly reduced the number of clients being tested at the 4-week follow-up point.

It should be noted that on the Monitoring form Part B (Equality section) that not all the questions were answered by the clients. Some of the figures presented may not add up to 100% due to rounding. Action has been taken to improve the quality of the data recorded in the future.

### **2. Health & Social Services Boards**

Within Northern Ireland there are four Health & Social Services Boards, Eastern, Northern, Southern, and Western, each with their own provision of smoking cessation services throughout their Health Board area. The set up of these services and collection of data was sporadic among the four boards.

In January 2000, the Eastern Health & Social Services Board started up their services and began to collect data, regarding the clients using the services, via the monitoring forms. At the same time Causeway clinic services, within the Northern Health & Social Services Board, began to run similar services. The Mid-Ulster pilot scheme followed in the summer of 2003. By January 2004 all services in place within the Northern Health & Social Services Board were up and running and collating the returns via the monitoring forms established by DHSSPS. The Western Health & Social Services Board services and data collection began in the first quarter of 2000 (April to June 2000). As for the Southern Health & Social Services Board, a commissioning pilot, for two clinics, was established in January 2003 and by January 2004 all services that were set up were using the monitoring forms.

### 3. Definitions

#### Services

- **Brief interventions** by General Practitioners (GPs) and other health professionals. These will be provided in the normal course of the professional's duties rather than comprising a 'new' service, and monitoring information about clients in receipt of such interventions is not therefore required centrally.
- **Specialist smoking cessation clinics/services**, usually clinics, run by smoking cessation specialist(s) who have received training for this role. The clinic/service will be evidence based and offer intensive treatment, usually in the form of one to one or group support over the course of 5 to 6 weeks, including the use of Nicotine Replacement Therapy. Clients may also receive treatment one-to-one if for any reason group sessions are judged not to meet their needs. Such a clinic/service may be situated in a major hospital, although it could be based in a community setting, have outreach clinics or operate on a peripatetic basis.

#### Quit Date

It is recognised that in certain cases some time may need to be spent with clients before they are ready to set a quit date. However only actual quit attempts are counted for monitoring.

On this basis the clinical viewpoint tends to be that a client should not be counted as a 'failure' if he/she has smoked in the difficult first days after the quit date, a client is counted as having successfully quit smoking if he/she has not smoked at all since two weeks after the quit date.

#### Follow-up

The four-week follow-up (and CO validation, if appropriate) must be completed within six weeks of the quit date. Persons not contacted within this time are treated as lost to follow-up for evaluation purposes.

#### Carbon monoxide (CO) validation

CO monitoring is normally carried out with all clients of the specialist smoking cessation clinics/services who self report as not having smoked since two weeks after the quit date, at both the four week and fifty-two week points.

#### Fifty-two week follow-up

All clients of the specialist clinics/services who self reported as having quit smoking at the 4 week follow-up should be followed-up again at 52 weeks, and their smoking status validated by CO monitoring.

### **Description of Deprivation Rank by Ward**

Electoral Ward level summaries of the Super Output Area (SOA) rankings have been developed for each domain and for the overall NI Multiple Deprivation Measure. The methodology used was a simple population weighted average for each of the constituent SOA rankings within each ward.

There are 582 wards in Northern Ireland. For each summary each ward is given a score (in green) and rank (in blue); a rank of 1 indicates that the Ward is the most deprived according to the measure, and 582 is the least deprived.

#### Please Note

All scores are presented to two decimal places. In some cases Wards with apparently the same score will be given different ranks, according to their actual score.

These Measures have been constructed by the Social Disadvantage Research Centre at Oxford University. These figures are estimates and no warranty is given as to the accuracy or comprehensiveness of the data. All figures can only be reproduced if the source (Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency, 2005) is fully acknowledged.

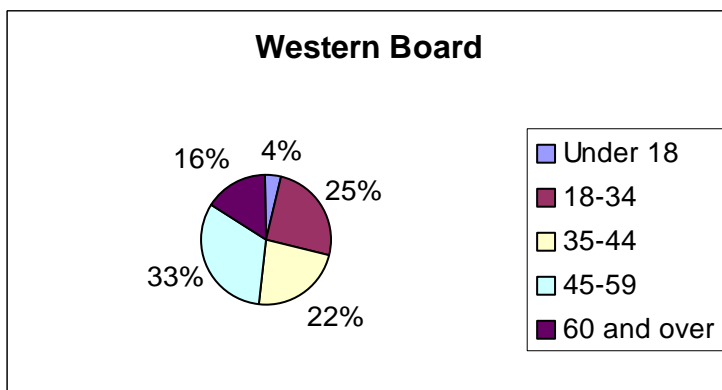
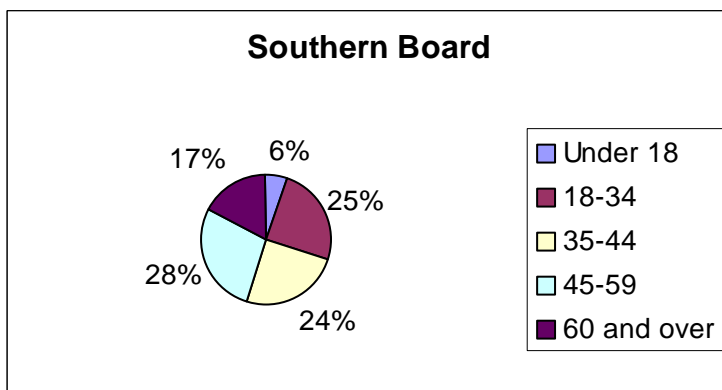
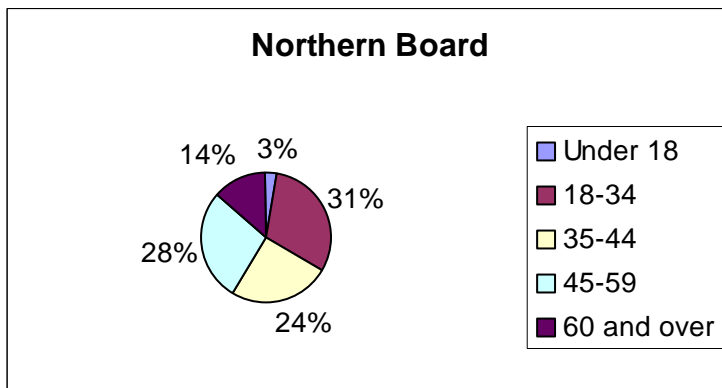
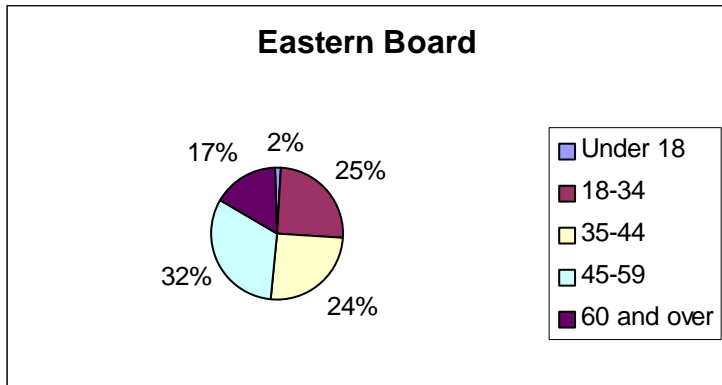
The figures below show the percentages of those accessing the smoking cessation services by gender and Health & Social Services Board.

**Gender:**



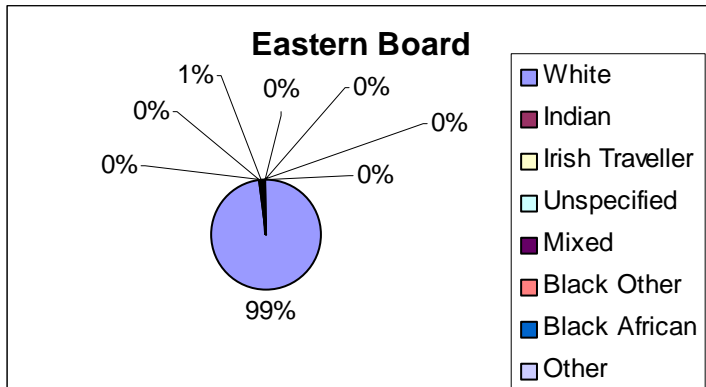
The figures below show the percentages of those accessing the smoking cessation services by age and Health & Social Services Board.

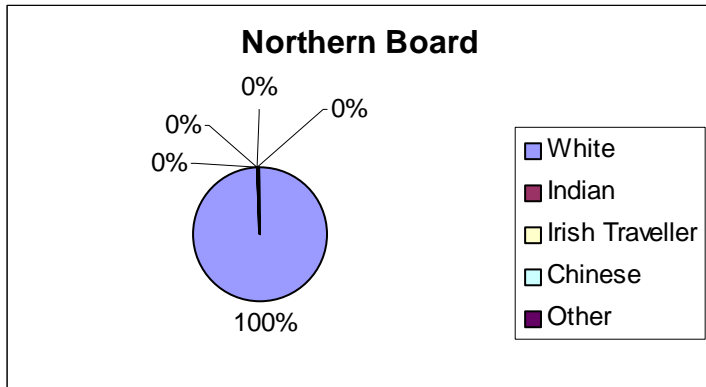


The figures below show the percentages of those who returned their equality monitoring form by ethnic background and Health & Social Services Board.

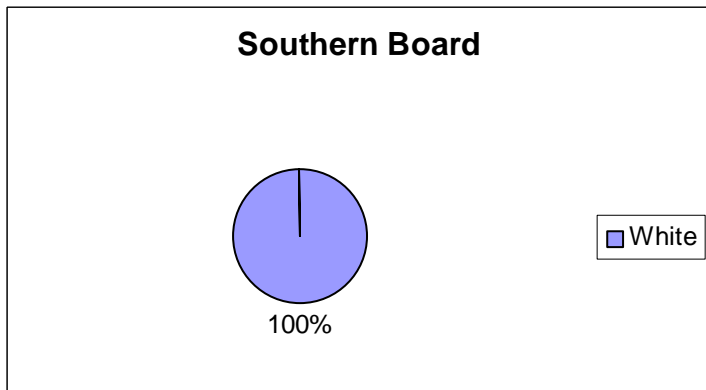

**Disability (Self Report):**



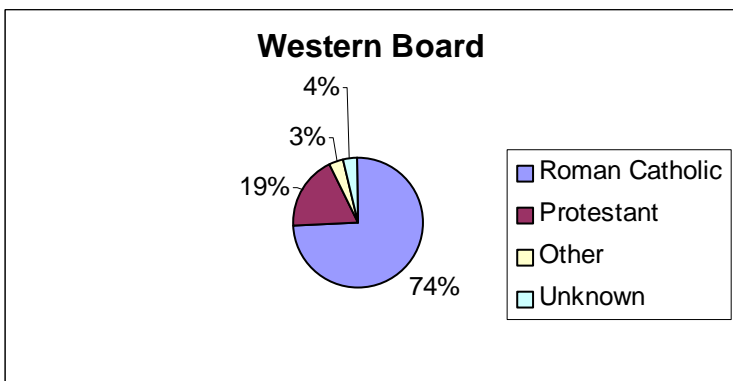
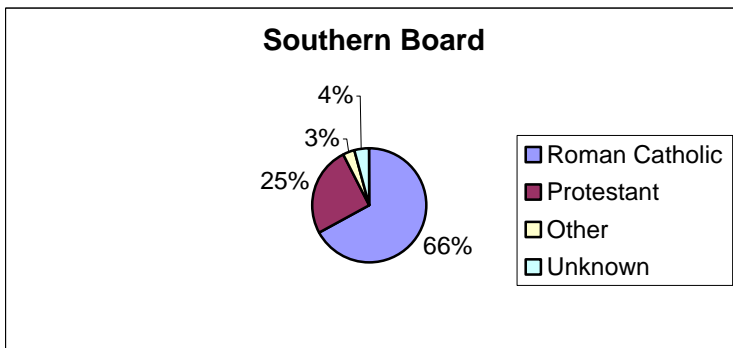
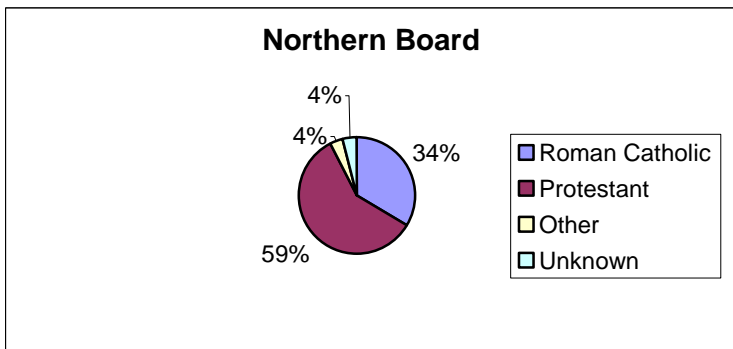
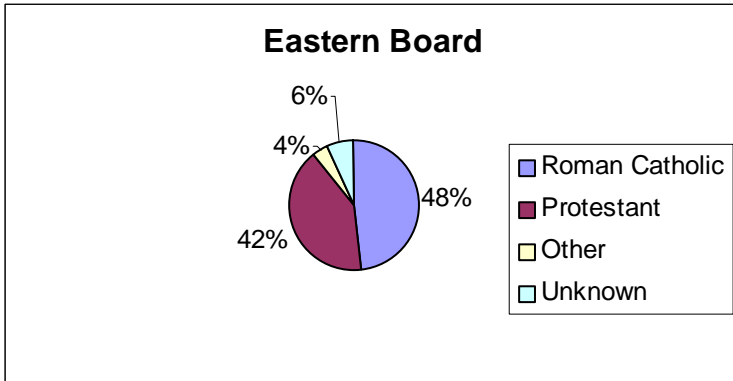
The figures below show the percentages of those who returned their equality monitoring form by dependants and Health & Social Services Board.

**Dependants:**



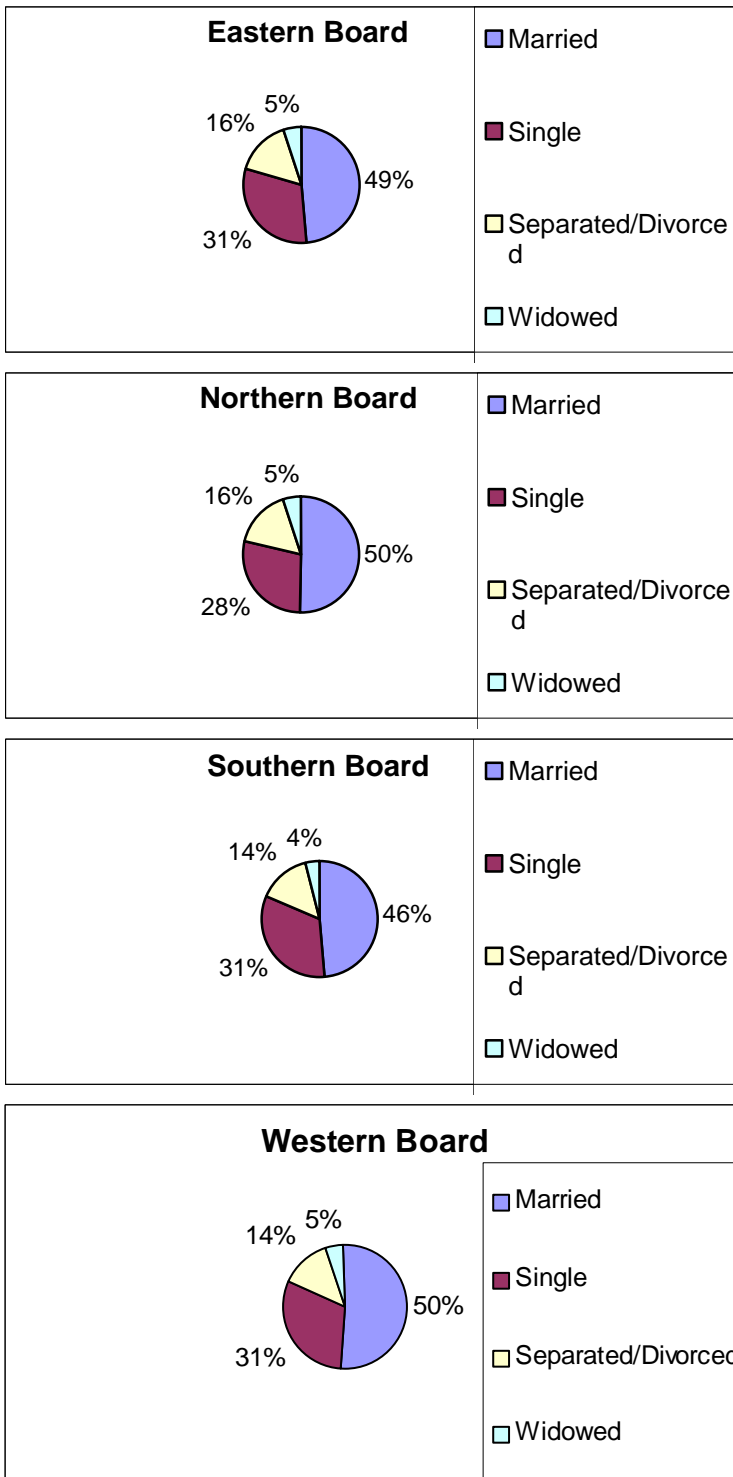
The figures below show the percentages of those who returned their equality monitoring form by community background and Health & Social Services Board.

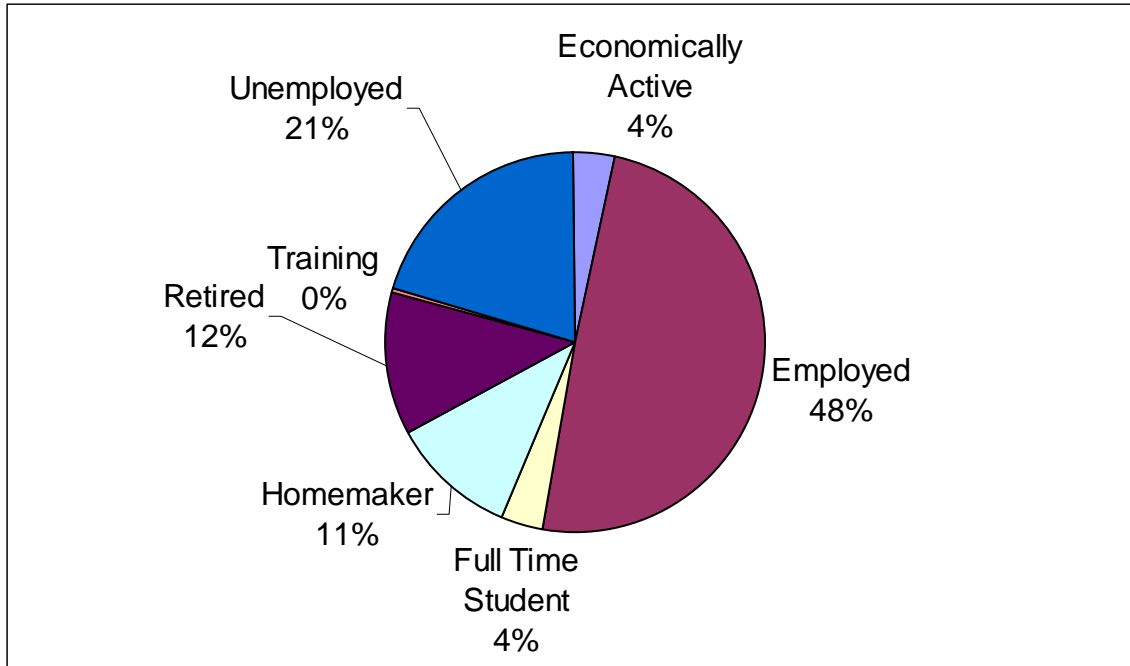

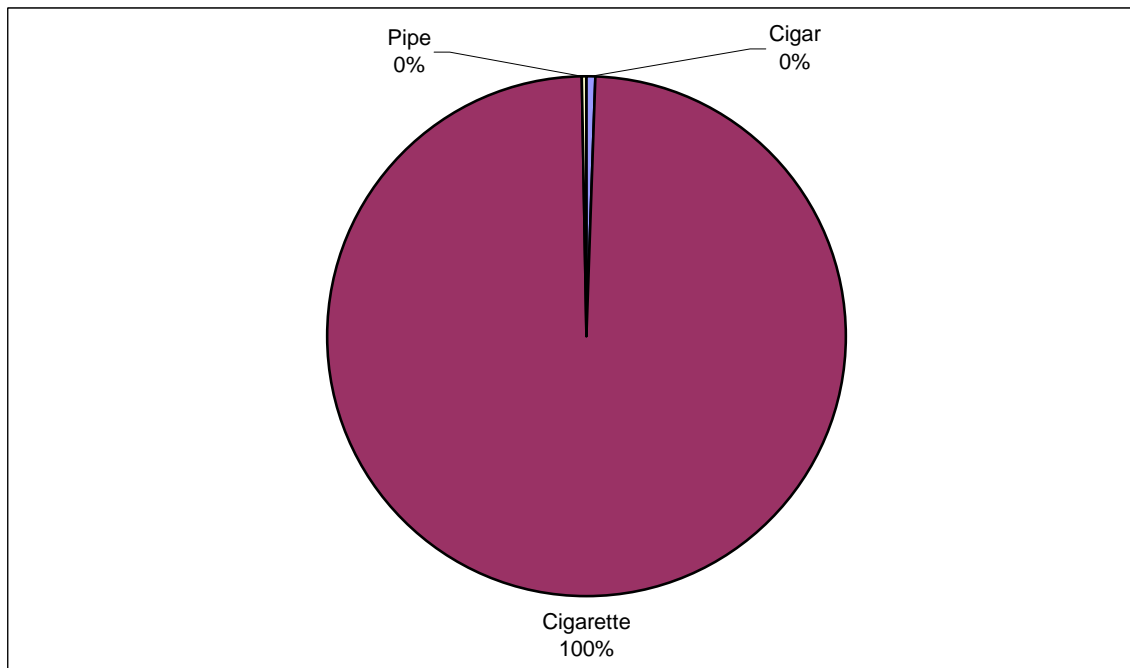

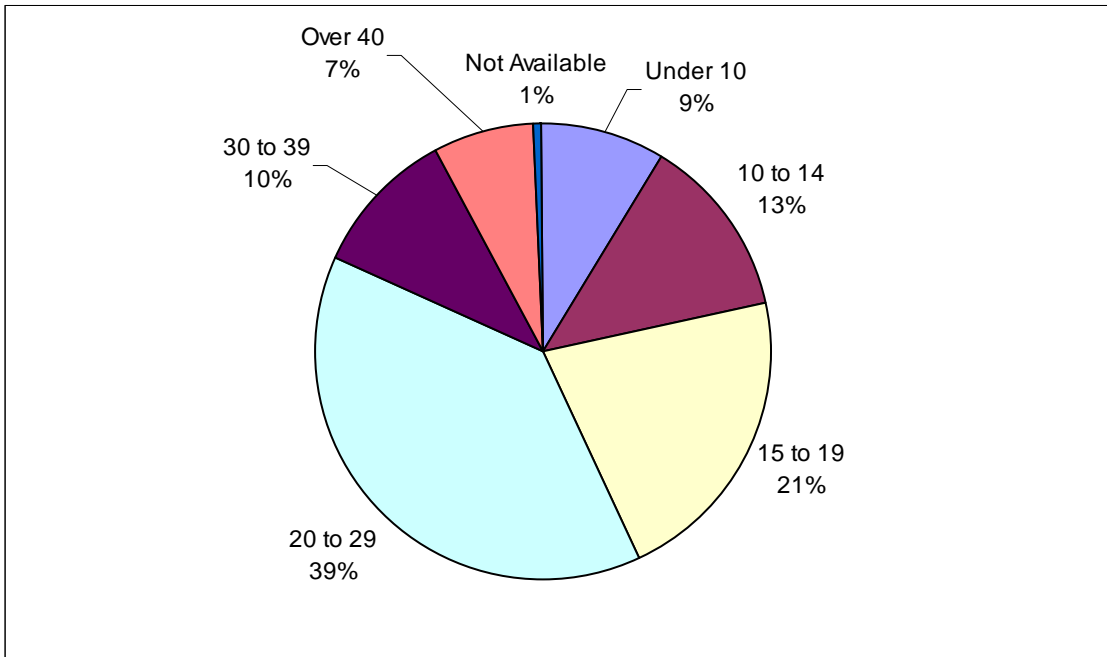
### Type of Tobacco Smoked



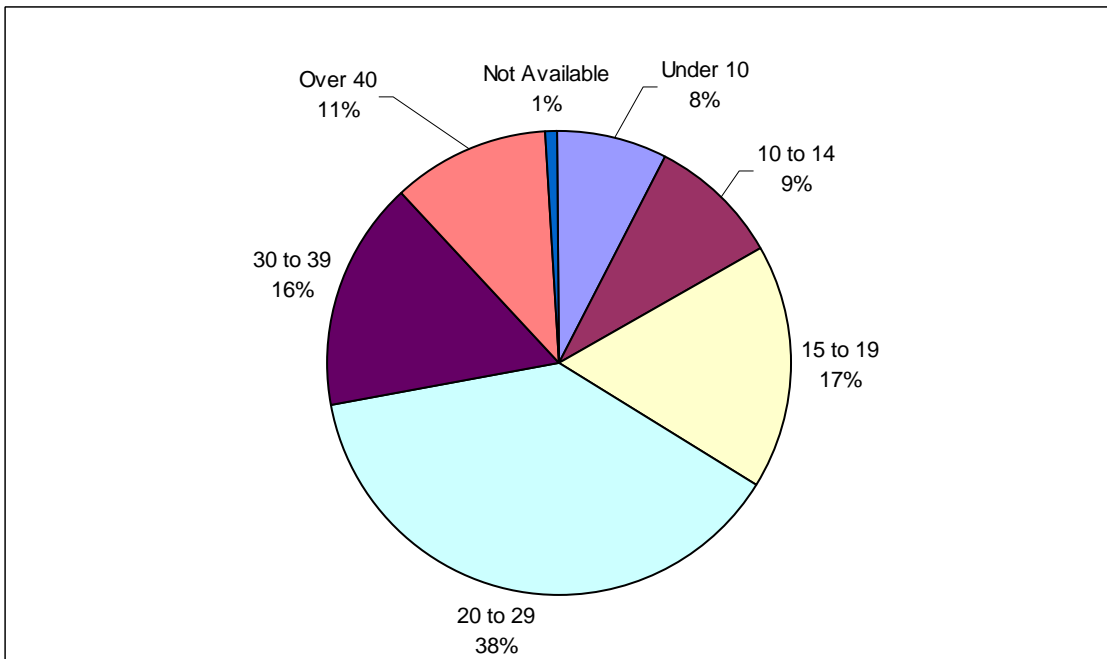

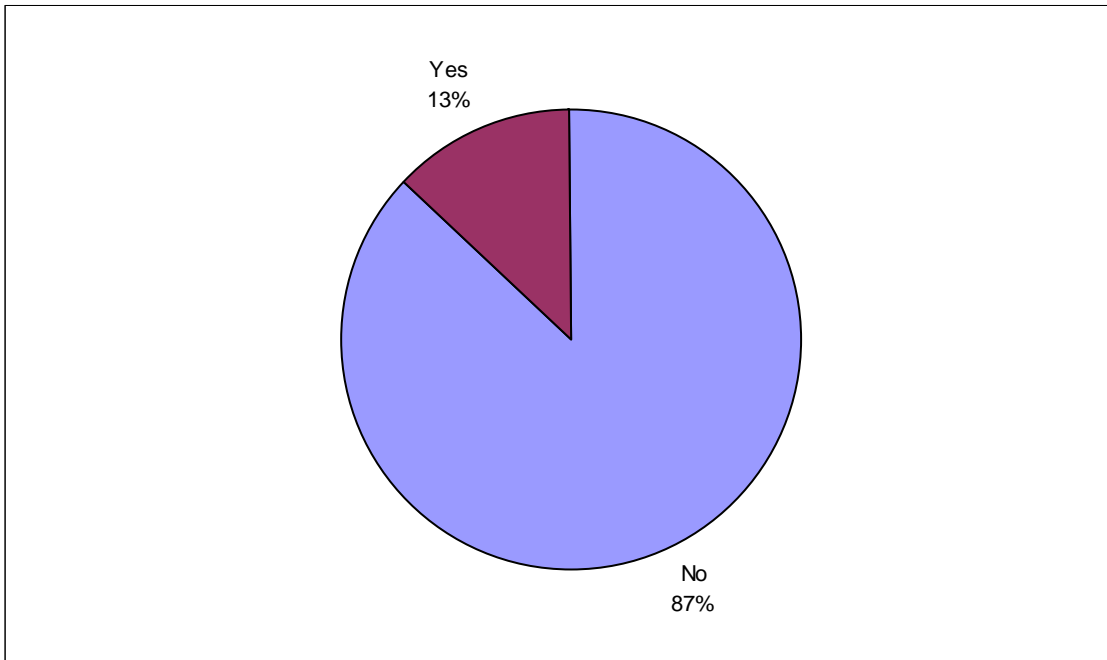
### Average Cigarettes smoked per weekday



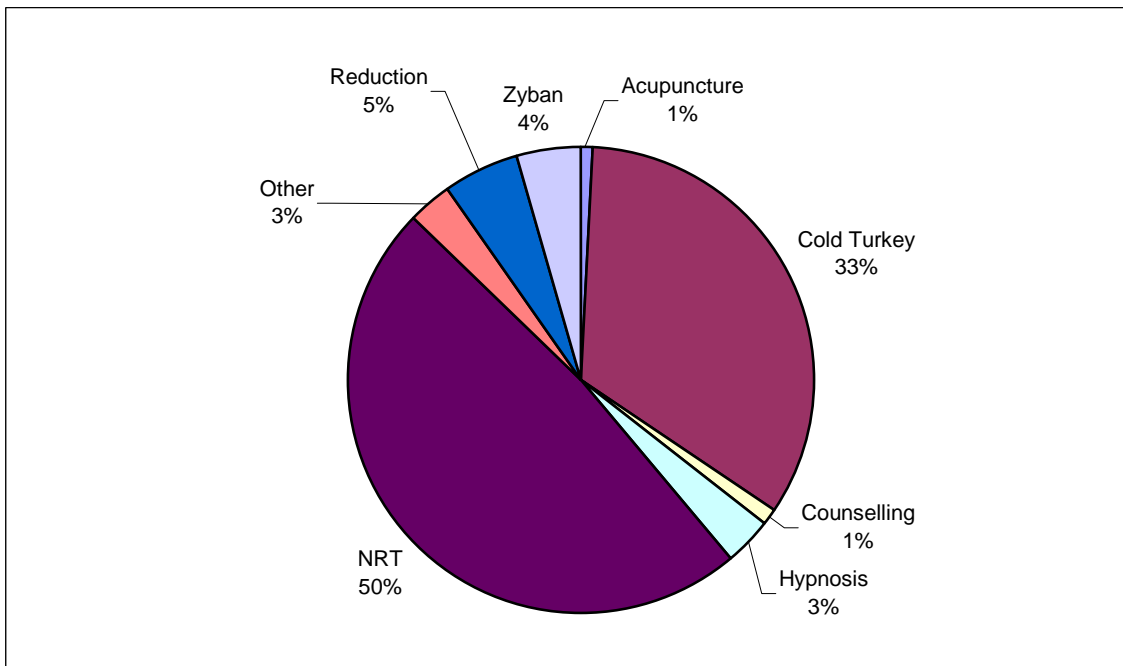
### Average Cigarettes smoked per weekend



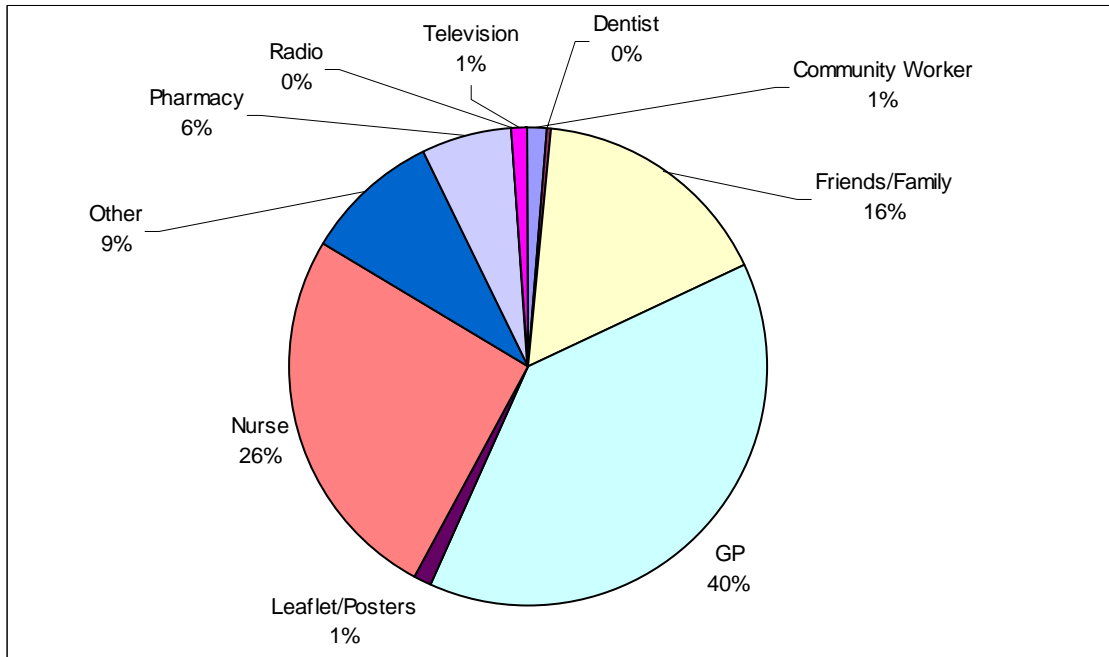
### Whether client previously participated in programme

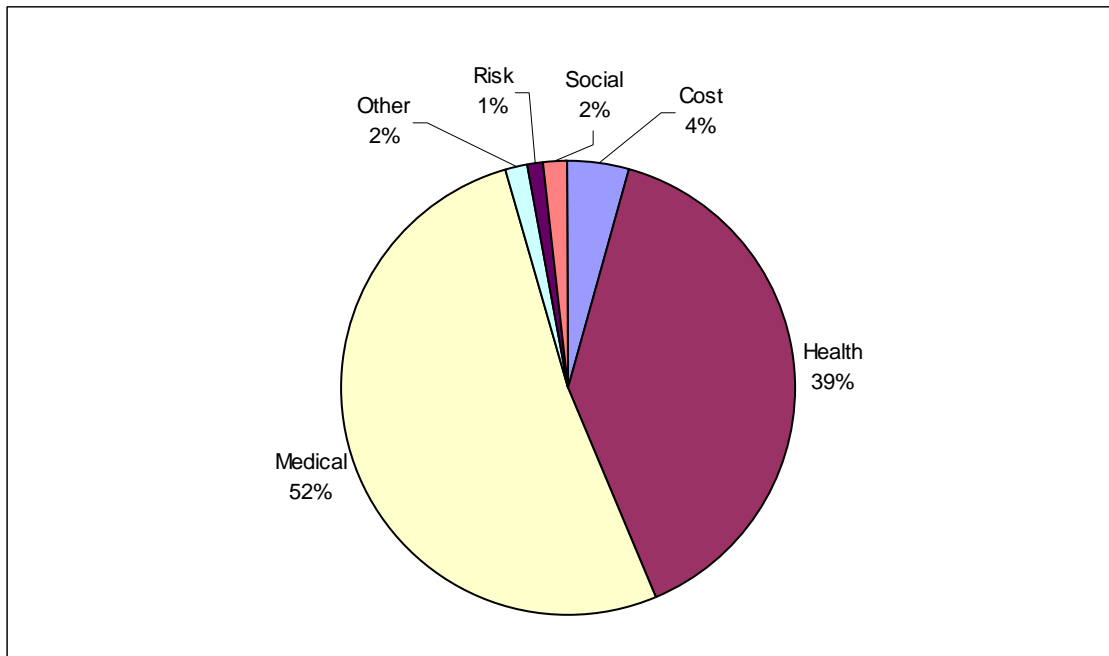


**Where did client hear about smoking cessation services**

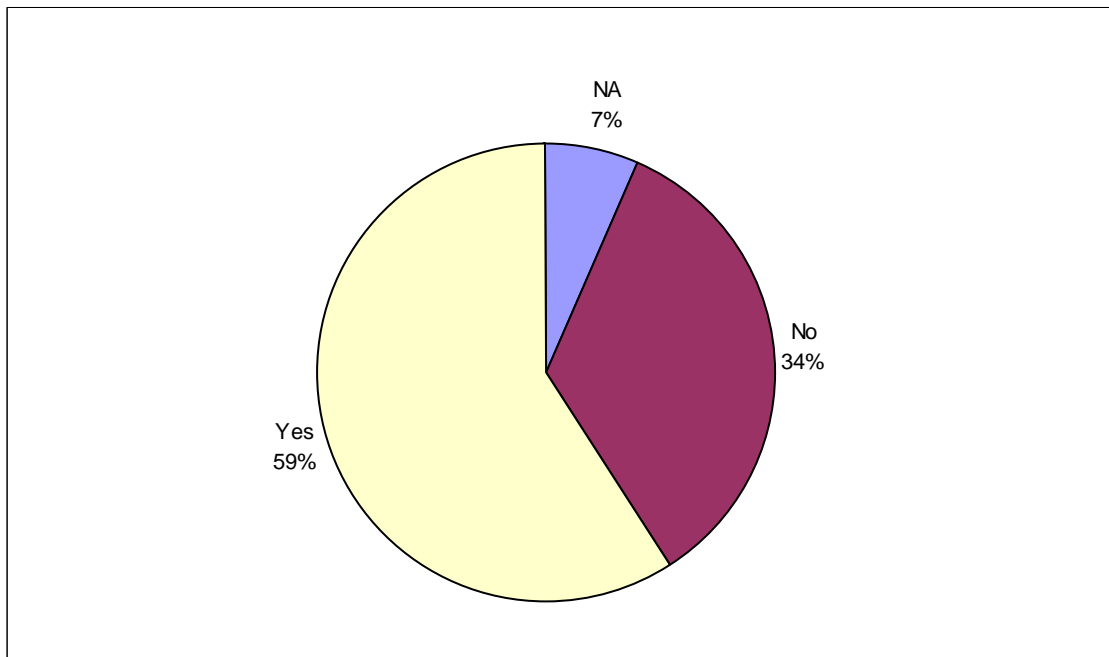

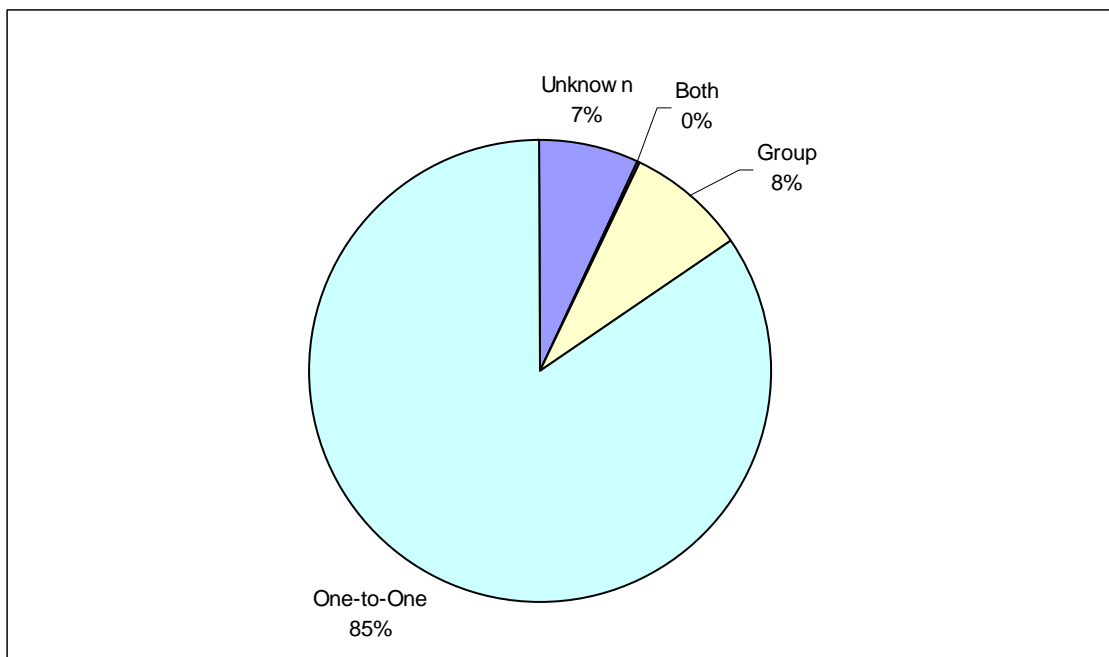
**What was client's reason for quitting**
